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THE VAST MAJORITY OF ALL ANCIENT HEBREW ISRAELITES WERE GODDESS WORSHIPPERS

Were you raised as a Jew, Christian or Muslim? Regardless of your answer, you may be aware that all Abrahamic faiths begin with the story of Abraham, formerly called Abram, who was said to be a "friend" of God in the biblical account (see Isaiah 41:8). However, many are unaware that Abram and his father lived in Ur, a land full of Pagan worship with idols of gods and goddesses everywhere to be seen. The famous Chaldeans, makers of the most trusted magickal talismans of their day, settled there later. Did they find an area which gave them inspiration, instruction even?

Magick and witchcraft were commonplace in Ur, and one can imagine the more ancient versions of Diagon Alley from Harry Potter that the city may have featured. Abram's father, Terah, was a maker and seller of idols, and one story found in the book of Jasher tells of the merchant Terah going away for a time, leaving his son to mind the store and the family shrine. In the story, Abram smashed 11 idols in the shrine room, leaving the largest one and placing the implement of destruction in the hand of that idol, to stage the scene as if the largest idol had smashed all the others. His father was furious and wasn't fooled by the gesture. Abram got into a lot of trouble for that blasphemous rebellion!

Not only was Abram steeped in polytheistic idolatry worship growing up, but his children seem to have never lost the habit. Sun worship, Goddess worship, and a trio who seem an awful lot like the many other Pagan triads of divinity (Father, Mother, Son) were rife in his descendant's lives for many generations, possibly even until today. Evidence of this can be found in Douglas Petrovich's

2017 book, The World's Oldest Alphabet, subtitled Hebrew as the Language of the Proto-Consonantal Script. Petrovich was backed by all major scholars and professors of related ancient text studies, unanimously. They had all suspected for a long time that this difficult-to-translate ancient alphabet was most likely Semitic, but they hadn't guessed it was actually Hebrew! The tablets and inscriptions they had were dated back to

between 1842 and 1446 BCE, a period that closely matches the period between the Israelites meeting up with the Egyptians and through their later enslavement by the Pharaoh Khufu. I would date some of them earlier by a few hundred years, placing the Exodus at the end of the Old Kingdom, but the dates come reasonably close, considering the methods used to date them.

In Petrovich's book, he provides translations of many ancient texts in this script, and some are set in the period of time that some historians insist never even happened. I had butterflies in my stomach when I first ordered this volume in 2018. The evidence suggests that this saga did happen, in fact, and that the Israelites, when enslaved in Egypt, were nearly all Goddess worshippers! According to Petrovich, the Israelites, then a nomadic nation of wandering people, met with the Old Kingdom Egyptians, and their initial impression was that they had much in common. They



recognized Hathor on the armor and banners of the Egyptians and saw her as the same Goddess as their Ba'aleth. These 'shining people' they met were hospitable to them because they served the same Goddess, and they welcomed them to an audience with the Pharaoh. That ruler liked them so much when he saw that they shared religion in common that he offered land for them to settle, and they accepted. This isn't just a bible story - we now have translated texts from the Hebrews of that day themselves, describing various parts of the same story. This is definitely the smoking gun many conflicted historians needed.

We are all familiar with the story of how Moses went up onto Mount Sinai to 'receive the tablets with the 10 commandments' (clearly, he was working with radioactive materials and creating them himself though), and while he was gone the Israelites got Aaron to create a golden calf idol for a ceremony they wanted to hold in honor of Hathor, who they sorely missed. Few actually think about the calf's significance, and make the Hathor connection, or realize that they already were a goddessworshipping people before they even met the Egyptians, so evidence is in order.Here's a brief overview proving various points we discussed and more, in the form of translated inscriptions:

Sinai 349, dated around 1480 BCE: "He sought occasion to cut away to barrenness our great number, our swelling without measure. They yearned for Hathor, but the quiver of our brothers was thoroughly despised, so he performed terror against their quiver and brought about a great cry of wailing." Here we see evidence that the Pharaoh of their day was oppressing them, and that they felt Hathor did not side with them but with the Egyptians. Fascinatingly, they "yearned for Hathor" – we see this from their own handwriting.

Sinai 353, dated around 1480 BCE: "It is a time to be hopeless. The Lady (Ba'aleth) had organized for battle. We banded together to remain with heads held high. We celebrated a festival of the sun, which came out in order to hold us back." Without Hathor's favor (or as they called Her, The Lady or Ba'aleth) they held a sun festival to Re (Ra), the Sun God of Egypt! They identified the Egyptians as the people of Hathor, so they felt that they had rebelled against Her, and hoped for Her forgiveness. Some of the other inscriptions had language referring to those who rebelled against Her as "apostates" by Petrovich's translation, and that those who offered her sacrifices and kept their devotion were rewarded with prosperity.

Sinai 357, dated around 1480 BCE: "A curse of 100-fold has passed through our people. A swooping has befallen us. A multitude has surrounded us. My father was completely depleted by the king." This matches, Petrovich notes, the time in history when the Israelites were oppressed militarily by the Egyptians. (Compare to the biblical account in Exodus 1:8-14.)

Sinai 361, dated to around 1446 BCE: "Our bound servitude had lingered. Moses then provoked astonishment. It is a year of astonishment because of the Lady" What? Not only is Moses named in this period-dated script, but they also give credit to Ba'aleth, The Lady, for Moses' actions? Was Moses actually acting under Her banner at first? How much of his own account was not actually truthful? It seemed, from the biblical account, that every time Moses did a magickal trick, the Egyptian priests could do it too. He had grown up in the house of the Pharaoh, in a time when all of the royal family was constantly educated, for their whole lives. Could he have been merely performing wellpracticed Egyptian magick?

Sinai 376 dates to the year 1772 BCE, they say, and it reads, "The house of the vineyard of Asenath and its innermost room are engraved. They have come to life." In the bible account, Phaoaoh gave Joseph a wife who was the daughter of Potiphar (priest of On), named Asenath. See Genesis 41:45. Here she is, mentioned by name on this ancient limestone inscription! This further anchors the story in reality, but it does much more. Here was Joseph's wife, after she was dead, being enshrined and magickal charms engraved and energized, brought to life! This isn't a custom peculiar to the Mosaic monotheistic worship brand. It's Pagan to the core, and it was recorded by Hebrew hands, not Egyptian.

What happened later, after the Hebrews settled in Canaan for an extended period of time? Centuries after leaving Egypt, the Hebrews formed two distinct kingdoms, Israel and Judah. The former encompassed cities such as Shechem and Samaria, while the latter included Jerusalem and its temple. Although the kingdoms separated due to a rebellion over heavy taxation, their main difference is noteworthy: while the smaller of the two, Judah, adhered somewhat to the God of Moses, the

much larger Israel, which contained the other ten tribes, returned to their prior idolatrous practices, including sun worship and other Pagan rituals. It may seem curious to ask how an entire nation could "return" to a way of life they supposedly abandoned long ago. In fact, it is probable that these Pagan practices were maintained within family units for generations, even throughout their time in the wilderness, their sojourn in Egypt, and their subsequent settlement in Canaan. Therefore, it is safe to assume that for the vast majority of their biblical history, from Abraham to the division of these kingdoms and beyond, the Hebrews were primarily Goddess-worshipping Pagans.

Although Douglas Petrovich's groundbreaking translation work is spotlighted here, there is a great deal more information available on this topic if you are interested. Check out the work of Frank Moore Cross to clearly see the connection between Israelite religion and Canaanite religion. Frank shows that Canaanite religion is largely the source of Israelite religion. Also, Raphael Patai explores ancient Hebrew goddesses and their place in early Hebrew religion. Where I separate from Patai, though, is that he states that these Pagan beliefs were supplanted by monotheistic beliefs. Still, it's a great read and there is a ton of background information that may frame this article better.

This offers clear evidence that, even so many generations from Abraham, his nation of Israel were Goddessworshipping Pagans. Many have noticed that the Israelites seemed to become attached to Egyptian Goddess worship while they lived there, and many have noted that the Goddess worship, especially the veneration of Asherah, was widespread in Israel and Judah up to the time of the Babylonian exile. I think that the evidence actually suggests much more than that, namely that the vast majority of all ancient Hebrew Israelites were Goddess worshipping Pagans all along.

You can talk with someone for hours about magical practice and potentially make a lifelong friend. You can honor the changes of your life in a supportive, albeit imperfect community, rather than be made to feel inadequate because of them. This is very special. It's even more true amongst Pagan musicians, I've found. My dearest friends and colleagues would all rather collaborate than compete; I treasure this attitude among us. We're here to make magic and to inspire others, and the Pagan community knows this and sees it in us. That recognition allows us to bloom and grow in astonishing, nourishing ways as performers and as people.

in Orlando on June 9, Pagan Spirit Gathering in Missouri from June 18-24, Sacred Harvest Fest north of MSP in Minnesota on August 12, and Hexenfest in NorCal on October 28!



KITCHN WITCH'S CAULDRON EGGS IN PURGATORY

Ingredients

1 tablespoons olive oil 1 clove garlic, peeled 1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes 1 red jalapeno, chopped fine 1 14 ounce can diced tomatoes 1/2 teaspoon salt 4 eggs 1 tablespoon grated Parmesan cheese

Toasted bread, to serve



Method

Add your oil to a frying pan over medium heat. Grate in the garlic clove using a microplane or fine grater, then add the crushed red pepper flakes and the chopped jalapeno. Let this cook for a minute or two or until it becomes fragrant and the jalapeno starts to soften a bit.

Add in the tomatoes and salt, and give it a good stir. Let this cook until it comes to a bubble.

Crack your eggs into four corners of the pan and sprinkle over the Parmesan cheese. Partialy cover the pan, allowing space for steam to escape, and let it gently bubble away for about five minutes or until the egg whites are set. Remove from heat.

Serve immediately with lots of toast and some chilli oil if you want a bit of extra heat.

MULTIPLE READINGS

When you're doing a reading for a specific situation or topic it's ill advised to do readings on it over and over. What for a few weeks - in would say a full moons cycle (4 weeks-ish) before revisiting the same questions. Multiple Readings can negate the message of the cards.

FINDING THE "RIGHT" ANSWER

With so many different resources for meanings available in books and online it's very easy to go searching for answers that you want... the answers that are convenient instead of trusting your own feelings and instincts.

KEEP IT SIMPLE

Choosing a complex or big spread will end up complicating a simple question. Most questions only require a few cards to bring you answers. Why complicate something that never needed to be?

BE OBJECTIVE

When you're doing a reading for yourself, it's always a good idea to talk to someone about it to get the opinion of someone else. You can be objective, yes; but I'd still day go to another reader friend and just get them to check it over in case you missed something important.

What is an Empath?



Roll up this piece of paper very tightly and burn it in the yellow candle's flame, saying, "I release my fears of lack, and embrace abundance, trusting that I will be supported on my continued journey on the path of success."

ORACLE REVIEW THE MAHÂBHÂRATA ORACLE BY GITA RASH REVIEW BY CATT FOY

So many oracle decks and tools are focused on European traditions—Celtic, Germanic, Scandinavian, etc. So it is refreshing to find new decks with a focus from other traditions. The Mahabarata Oracle is one such oracle deck presented from the ancient traditions of India. Possibly more ancient than the European traditions, India has a long-storied history of spiritual exploration and development. So, from the tradition that brought us yoga, chakras, and karma, comes this insightful spiritual deck.

Like many oracle decks, here you will find many familiar archetypes, presented with a touch of Indian wisdom.

Some of the images remind me more of Norse gods or DC Comics superheroes and less like genuine Indian subcontinental art, which is a bit of a disappointment. With some exceptions, the women are uniformly slim, young and beautiful and the men are uniformly beefy, overblown warrior-types (move over Arnold!). I wish the illustrations looked more like something right out of the Bhagavad-Gita with the grace and balance of ancient Indian styles.

The cards are sturdy but not so stiff they cannot be easily shuffled. The colors are vivid and the images are rich in detail. The human images depict a wide range of diversity, a balance of male and female, and characters that could be from many places in the world: the Asian Steppes, the Indian subcontinent, southeast Asia, Europe, Africa, the Middle East.

Having the cards numbered make for a quick look-up for meanings and one does not have to slog through arbitrary groupings trying to figure out where you card is listed. In using the cards, the oracle did not disappoint, offering insightful, useful and encouraging advice. All in all, a deck worthy to add to one's card collection. Atomos is one of the creatures that can be summoned in the final fantasy series, he also appears as a boss as well. Atomos appears as a large thing with an enormous mouth that sucks in everything in its path. In Final Fantasy 12 Atomos appears as an airship alongside the Ifrit, the Shiva and the Alexander. In Final Fantasy 13 Atamos is a deity-like being that is tasked by its creator to dig subterranean tunnels.

Researching the entomology of Atomos was like trying to see through mud, but I found something that could potentially make some sense. Atomos is the Greek word for 'invisible' and is the root of the word atom. When Atomos attacks everything is sucked into its mouth, and it's supposed that while inside its mouth everything is broken down to its atomic level, or it is shrunken down to the size of an atom.





BOOK SPOTLIGHT

Pagans By Ethan Doyle White

A clear, concise and detailed historical analysis of the eclectic and beautiful visual and material culture of paganism.

Modern methods for neopagans to connect to and honor this popular Goddess include offerings and meditation, and personal anecdotes from the author's experiences are included as well.


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
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
